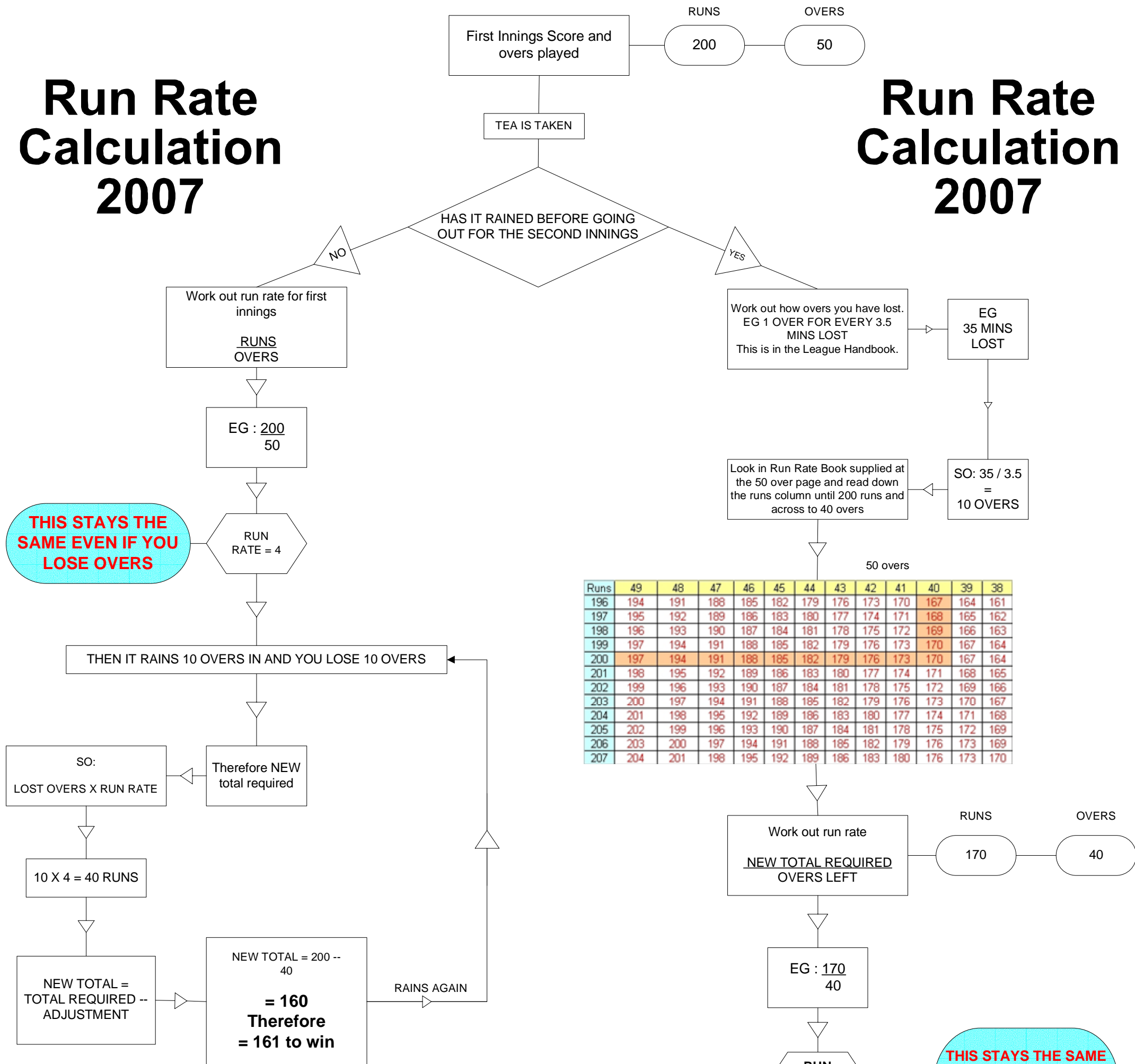


# Run Rate Calculation 2007

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You can do the above until you reach a min of 26 overs when no further runs can be deducted

You can only do the above ONCE until you reach a min of 26 overs

- Notes:**
- 1 If the start of the match is delayed, each side will lose one over for each 7 minutes lost
  - 2 Once the first innings has started it will be played to a conclusion to the number of over's decided.
  - 3 The time available for the second innings will be based on the start time , 17 over's for the last hour plus one over for every additional 3.5 minutes
  - 4 Calculation tables will be provided for each club, so the scorers - teams can make the initial calculation once the umpires have determined the time remaining.
  - 5 All calculations have been made to three decimal places.
  - 6 The reduction to the over's and total will be shown on the scoreboard.
  - 7 In the unlikely event of a match having to be abandoned mid-over in the second innings, calculations will be based on the score at the completion of the last over.

If less than 26 overs are available, the match may continue if either team feels they can score the runs required in the over's available (less than 26), or dismiss their opponents

If neither of these occurs then the match is a draw.
